30 points Career goals: Describe goals as they pertain to applicant's professional development and continued competence.

30 points Developing skills: How continuing education activity will further applicant's goals.

15 points Financial Support: Demonstrate need for financial support.

15 points Commitment: Demonstrate commitment to ongoing continuing education activities.

10 points Letters of support: Submit letter of support from employer/supervisor and a nurse colleague.

At the end of the activity, the recipient must submit a copy of the certificate of completion reflecting completion of educational course(s). Also required is a short report, 500 words or less, that shares an example of how knowledge learned through the educational programs attended resulted in a positive impact on worker health and safety. Reports will be published on the website <u>www.aaohn.org</u> and may be used in other AAOHN publications. Reports are due by May 1st, 2025. Scholarship recipients are not eligible to apply for a scholarship the following year but may reapply in subsequent years, contingent upon successful completion of activity and availability of funds, up to a maximum of two additional years (three years total).
